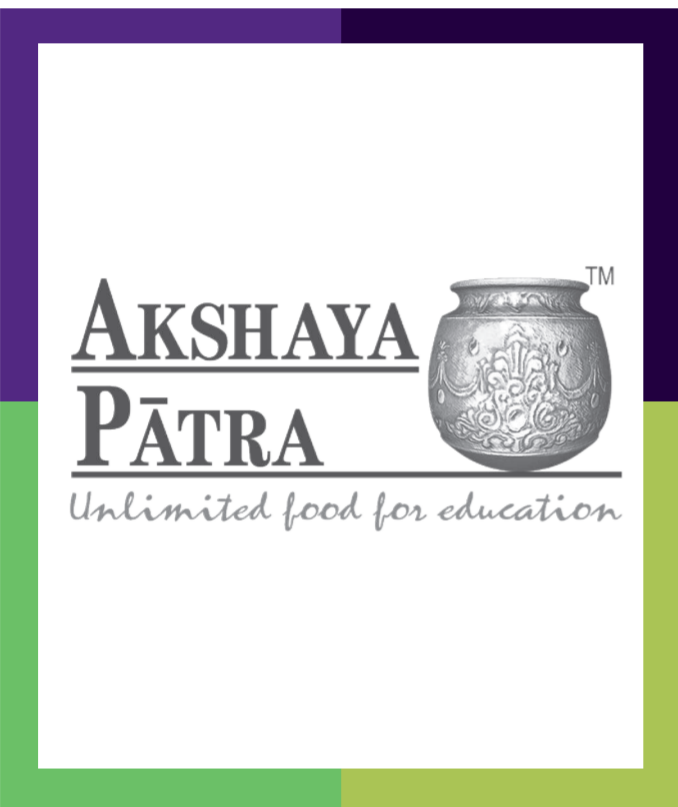
Fuel a Dream
